Part One: Junkyard Prophet/Main Assembly



Junkyard Prophet is the opening part of our assembly program, including a huge light show, and fog machines, *which will be used at each school.* Voted second-best unsigned band nation wide and using the type of music



your kids can relate to, the band is used as a tool to open up the heart and minds of each student to receive the message to follow. If at all possible we would like the assembly to be held in an auditorium.

Bradlee Dean, the founder/overseer of "You Can Run But You Cannot Hide," stands at the authoritative forefront of our group. Having grown up on the north side of Minneapolis, he understands the corruption which has plagued this generation, and is consumed with a passion to see lives changed for the better.
